1. Curb on groundwater extraction soon

16 August 2010

Waking up to reports that the Kathmandu Valley is drying up and groundwater level is decreasing, the government is introducing a groundwater management policy within two weeks to regulate extraction of groundwater. Such a policy will be the first of its kind that will restrict the extraction of groundwater in the "danger zone" and help the government launch different water recharging programmes. 2. 3.5m Pak children at disease risk

16 August 2010

3. Wildfires spread in Portugal's national parks

12 August 2010

Authorities in Portugal are deploying firefighting aircraft and army bulldozers to halt wildfires sweeping through two of the country's national parks. 4. Flood relief elusive in Nepal

Many villagers of six VDCs and neighbouring areas in Susari district (East Nepal) are forced to starve and live in the open sky due to lack of relief materials. Some of them have contracted waterborne disease after they consumed contaminated water.

5. China landslide toll rises to 702

11 August 2010

The death toll from landslides in northwestern China more than doubled to 702, as rescue crews in three Asian countries struggled to reach survivors from flooding that has imperiled millions. More than 1,000 other people were still listed as missing.

6. US adds \$20 mn for Pakistan flood relief

11 August 2010

The US will provide an additional \$20 million in relief funding for the flooding in Pakistan that has killed more than 1,600 people in the last two weeks, a US official said on Tuesday. That amount brings the total US contribution to \$55 million and will help account for a wider area now being affected by the flooding, said Mark Ward, acting director of the State Department's Office of Foreign Disaster Assistance.

7. Strong 6.0 magnitude quake shakes Vanuatu

11 August 2010

A strong 6.0 magnitude quake has shaken the Pacific island of Vanuatu, US monitors said on Wednesday, a day after a bigger tremor triggered a small tsunami and sent thousands fleeing for the hills. 8. Seven killed in Bajura landslide

10 August 2010

Seven people, including four members of a family, died in a landslide in Bajura (Far West Nepal) on Monday night. A team of Nepal Police, Red Cross Society and locals recovered the bodies on Tuesday morning. A Nepal Army team was dispatched to the area as the village is still at the risk of landslide for it has been raining continuously. The administration provided Rs. 30,000 to the families of each victim killed in the landslide.

Sixteen Nepali nationals have died in flash floods in and around Leh in Jammu & Kashmir state of India. The Indian Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) on Tuesday confirmed the death of 23 foreigners, including 16 Nepalis, in the floods that wrecked havoc in Ladakh on Friday. 13. China Orders Polluting and Unsafe Factories To Shut Down - 2,000 Sites In 18 Industries Affected 10 August 2010

China has ordered more than 2,000 highly polluting, unsafe or energy inefficient plants to shut down within two months, state media reported Monday. Environmental campaigners welcomed the measure, saying the announcement went well beyond previous orders in naming specific facilities and outlining stiff penalties for firms that do not comply by the end of September.

14. Central Europe under Water - Heavy Flooding Continues Following Deadly Weekend 09 August 2010

Eleven people died in Central Europe over the weekend after flash floods inundated several towns in Poland, the Czech Republic and eastern Germany. With waters now advancing northwards, the danger has not yet subsided. It was water level that had never been seen before. The Neisse River on the German-Polish border hit 7.07 meters (23 feet) on Sunday morning in the town of Gorlitz, the highest level ever recorded since systematic measurements began almost a century ago. Normal level for the river is a mere 1.7 meters.
