Guidelines for authors

Scope

The abstract must be based on original research conducted in the Kailash Sacred Landscape covering all or part of Pulan County, Tibet Autonomous Region of China; Pithoragarh District of Uttarakhand State, India; and Baitadi, Bajhang, Darchula and Humla districts of Nepal. Research can focus on any of the following thematic areas:

- Regional cooperation
- Biocultural diversity
- · Resilient livelihoods and post-pandemic recovery
- Landscape and ecosystem services
- Climate change
- Gender and social inclusion

Guidelines for abstracts:

- The abstract must include a short background, methods, main results, discussion, and conclusion.
- The length of the abstract must not exceed 500 words.
- Five keywords must be included in alphabetical order.
- Authors must indicate their preference of presentation as either oral or lightning talks.

The submitted abstracts will be reviewed by the Kailash CAFE Knowledge Committee. The Committee reserves the right to accept or decline the submission and to allocate the method of presentation, i.e., oral presentations or lightning talks.
