Anu serves as a lead expert on the Tourism Panel on Climate Change (TPCC), an assessor for the Mountain Protection Award (UIAA), reviewer for *Current Research in Environmental Sustainability*, and faculty member of the Himalayan University Consortium's Working Group on Mountain Heritage and Tourism. Rigzin Lachic, a Ladakhi entrepreneur, is redefining tourism in Ladakh by integrating sustainability with cultural preservation. After earning an engineering degree from NSIT Delhi, she worked in Japan and later contributed to a startup in Delhi before returning home to establish Dolkhar—a boutique stay that celebrates Ladakh's architecture, crafts, and local ingredients while prioritizing environmental responsibility. She also cofounded Hatti, a social enterprise supporting local artisans, serves as an advisor for sā Ladakh, and launched Tsas by Dolkhar, an initiative focused on sustainability in food and hospitality. As the first woman President of the All Ladakh Hotel and Guest House Association (ALHGHA), Lachic has been a key advocate for policies that balance tourism growth with ecological and cultural sensitivity. Her eff orts have earned recognition from Condé Nast Traveler, TIME Magazine, and the SATTE Awards, among many others. A frequent speaker on sustainable tourism, she has contributed to discussions at the Serendipity Arts Festival, ET TravelWorld Conclave, and the "Asia Live Symposium - Regenerative Travel" in Singapore. Through her work, Lachic continues to shape a more thoughtful and regenerative future for tourism in Ladakh.

Vivek Pyakuryal is the Founder and CEO of Nana Hotels & Resorts, a hospitality group in Nepal recognized for pioneering sustainable tourism in rural and ecologically sensitive areas. He leads two flagship eco-properties: Nana Jungle Resort (Chitwan), at the buffer zone of Chitwan National Park, and Nana Mountain Resort (Dhampus, Kaski), along the Annapurna trekking route. His work emphasizes climate-resilient infrastructure, community-based experiences, waste and water management, and local economic empowerment. Under his leadership, Nana's properties have introduced initiatives such as eliminating single-use plastics, solar lighting, sustainable architecture, flood-mitigation planning, and sourcing over 70% of annual supplies directly from local farmers and artisans. Vivek has collaborated with ICIMOD, Swisscontact, and Impact Hub Kathmandu on sustainability projects. He brings an operational perspective to sustainable tourism, integrating environmental stewardship with business viability. He holds a Master's in International Relations from the University of Melbourne (Class of 2012).
